

**Minutes from the Commission Meeting held on
November 10, 2008**

The Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the Town of Englewood met in regular session on Monday, November 10, 2008 at 6:00 P.M. in the Community Center.

Mayor Raymond Roach called the meeting to order with Commissioners Tony Hawn, Todd Brown, Neil Moses and Amos Brock present.

Invocation was given by Commissioner Brock.

Brock stated that the weather alert system was in the process of being installed.

October Minutes—Motion was made by Hawn, seconded by Brown to accept the October 2008 Minutes. Hawn Aye, Brown Aye, Moses Aye, Brock Aye and Roach Aye.

Resolution #83—Motion was made by Hawn, seconded by Brown to adopt Resolution #83; a resolution establishing a policy for the purpose of property owner(s), who request water service to cleanup property, pay a water deposit fee. The resolution states that all property owners will pay a deposit in the amount of \$150.00 and a service charge in the amount of \$25.00. The water may be on for ten (10) days after which time the water usage will be taken from the deposit and the remainder will be refunded to the property owner(s).Hawn Aye, Brown Aye, Moses Aye, Brock Aye and Roach Aye

Mayor Roach stated that the Town had received a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$250,000.00 and the Town will pay \$16,000 which will be for improvement to the sewer system.

Mayors Wellness Campaign—Motion was made by Hawn, seconded by Brown to adopt the Mayors Wellness Campaign which requests that all residents of this community join us in supporting the Mayors Wellness Campaign to encourage the residents of the Town of Englewood to participate in activities to promote exercise, eating properly and living healthier and better lives. Hawn Aye, Brown Aye, Moses Aye, Brock Aye and Roach Aye.

Mayor Roach requested that the Board examine the water tank report and approach the subject at the next Board meeting.

Water Lines on County Road 408—No discussion was made regarding this business.

Interim Police Chief Wright read the October 2008 Police Department report.

Town Manager Cass stated that the property on Pin Street had been cleaned up and he was in the process of trying to collect the money for the cleanup from the property owners.

Roach then asked City Attorney Doris Matthews where the Town stood regarding the collection of delinquent taxes. Matthews stated that her office was still waiting on the final papers, but that the collection should begin soon.
