

Minutes from the Commission Meeting held on

August 5, 1986

The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Englewood met in a regular session on August 5, 1986 at 7:30 p.m. Present were Commissioners Nichols, Reid, Middleton, and Barnett.

After a call to order by the Mayor, the minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Reid and seconded by Nichols to accept the minutes presented. All voted ayes.

The following resolution was then introduced and read in full:

After discussion of the above, a motion was made by Nichols and seconded by Reid to adopt the resolution. All voted aye.

William Dorman of Hensley-Schmidt Engineers was present and informed the Board of the progress that was being made in the Conner Addition and Sawmill Road ares regarding sewer.

Commissioner Reid next asked the Board to move a street light that he had found seemingly benefited no one to Hwy 411 S. where there was hardly no lighting. A motion was then made by Barnett and seconded by Nichols for the Recorder to check with AUB on the location of the light and if it was the city's then move it accordingly.

It was agreed unanimously by the Board that patrolman D.T. Nation could not return to his former position with the police department if he was not elected to Sheriff.

Motion was then made and duly seconded by Nichols and Barnett respectively that any expenditure over \$100 and not yet budgeted must be approved by the Board of Commissioners. All ayes.

Lynn Ingram of the Englewood Fire Department then presented the Board with a MTAS Standard Operating Procedures for fire department and strongly urged its passage. The Commissioners stated that they would like a chance to review the manual first.

The Board of Commissioners then discussed naming of the mini-park.

As a point of discussion, the Board was informed that MTAS was working on a Sewer Ordinance for the town.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Barnett and seconded by Reid. All ayes.
