

Minutes from the Commission Meeting held on

January 9, 1987

The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Englewood met in called session on January 9, 1987. After a call to order by the Mayor, it was noted that those present were Middleton, Conner, and Armstrong.

Upon a motion by Armstrong and seconded by Reid, the Ordinance to delete Chapter 2 of the Englewood Municipal Code in its entirety and replace with new Chapter 2 Title 8, was passed with all Commissioners voting aye. The new Title 8 Chapter Ordinance was then declared passed on second reading.

Present at the meeting also were Dr. Lee of Woods Memorial Hospital and the hospital administrator. They were present to request that they be allowed to set a double wide trailer on the Wilson Drugs Property as a temporary doctor office. It was recommended by the Planning Commission that they be allowed to do this.

The Wood's Memorial representatives stated that their desire was to provide services for those who needed a doctor after Dr. Cleveland's office hours, probably 6-10 p.m., Monday-Saturday. Their plans involved using the temporary trailer for 6 months and then going in with Dr. Cleveland.

Commissioner Armstrong then proposed that they look into the possibility of increasing the hours spent in Englewood, possibly building their own clinic or getting something from Charles Wilson concerning the purchase of property to make it a permanent site. Discussion of the matter then ensued.

Motion was then made by Middleton that Board of Commissioner approval be granted for the setting of a temporary office building for 6 months on the Charles Wilson property. At the end of the 6 months, the structure will be moved with the staff joining Dr. Cleveland's practice or building or leasing structure for a permanent site for the clinic. This temporary approval would be granted with details to be worked out with the City Attorney and the Woods Hospital Administrator. This motion was seconded by Armstrong. All ayes.

A motion to adjourn was then made by Armstrong and seconded by Middleton. All ayes.
