The Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the Town of Englewood, Tn met in regular session Tuesday, December 5, 1989, at 7:30 p.m. in the Assembly Room at City Hall.

Recorder Goodin ask that the Board consider placing an availability charge on gas before gas customers begin having the service disconnected next spring.

The Board then discussed houses on Niota Rd. belonging to the Williams Estate that needed to be condemned. The Attorney stated that he would send letters concerning this problem to the owners of said property.

The Attorney informed the Board that he would have a list of unpaid back taxes to present to the Commission at the next meeting.

Motion was made by Lynn Brown, seconded by Lendell Armstrong to adjourn

The Mayor stated that a letter was sent to TML requesting a 30 day extension on the problem concerning the Fire Dispatcher's work shifts. The Attorney then instructed the Mayor to begin proceedings concerning the transference of dispatch calls to the McMinn County Jail.
