

**Minutes from the Commission Meeting held on
October 8, 1990**

The Mayor and the Board of Commissioners met in called session, Monday, October 8, 1990, at 9:00 a.m. in the assembly room at City Hall.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Conner with Commissioners Armstrong, Brown, and Long present. Commissioner Bob Cass was unable to attend.

Motion was made by Commissioner Brown, seconded by Commissioner Armstrong to hold second reading on Ordinance 100290. All ayes.

Discussion was then held concerning the four-laning of HWY 411. Armstrong informed the Board that the Highway Department Staff had called asking if the Town understood the cost and actual tax that would be lost if the highway came through Englewood. Armstrong asked Recorder C.A. Goodin what the cost of moving the utilities would be. Goodin stated that he could only give a rough estimate of around three to five hundred thousand dollars.

Armstrong stated that if the highway came through town that 25% of the tax dollars would not come back to the Town as some businesses such as Bain and Holden would not be relocated in Englewood. Armstrong then stated that an overpass would have to be provided for school children crossing the new highway at cost to the Town of around \$380,000.00.

The Board stated that a letter would need to be sent to the State informing them of which route the Board would prefer the new highway to go.

Motion was made by Armstrong, seconded by Long that a letter be sent stating that the Board preferred that the Alternate B route around Englewood be taken.

Motion was made by Armstrong, seconded by Brown that the meeting be adjourned. All ayes.
