Minutes from the Commission Meeting held on

August 9, 1999

The Mayor and Board and Commissioners of the Town of Englewood met in regular session on Monday, August 9, 1999, at 6:00 P.M., in the Assembly Room at Englewood City Hall.

Mayor Simpson called the meeting to order with Commissioners Davis, Raper and Cass present. The invocation was given by Commissioner Davis.

Officer Mike Hull recently held a Neighborhood Watch meeting with residence living in the area behind the school. This was due to problems that had occurred recently. Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Davis to purchase eight neighborhood watch signs. All Ayes.

Commissioner Cass stated that the Board needed to look at cleaning up property owned by the city. He stated that it was hard to ask others to do cleanup when the city had property needing cleaning.

Concerning the fingerprinting fee being charged by the county, city attorney Heb Williams stated that the city did not have much choice concerning the matter, Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Raper for Englewood to pay the \$2000.00 fingerprinting fee to the McMinn County Sheriff's Department. All Ayes.

Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Raper to accept the monthly billing errors in the amount of \$6786.40. All Ayes.

Item F in the Agenda: Old sign at plant was tabled.

Library Board member Bobbie Dickson then discussed Bill Gate's donation of four computers to the library totaling \$15,934.00. This donation is contingent upon the computers being put on the Internet. Motion was made by Cass. seconded by Davis to approve placing the computers on line and purchasing a table to hold them. All Ayes.

Upon recommendation of Chief Cooley, motion was made by Davis, seconded by Cass to approve Chuck Reid as a Reserve Police Officer. All Ayes.

In June 1999 the board receives an estimate for street paving in the amount of \$56,743.60. the board approved \$46,000.00 in paving. Commissioner Cass asked that the board also approve paving the balance of the estimate at this time. Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Davis to approve the balance of the estimate for paving streets be spent at this time. All Ayes.

Raymond Roach stated that the street in front of Margaret Carrol's needed paving and that CSX had agreed to fix the crossing. All Ayes.

The board noted that people were now being allowed to gather left over bricks from the Eureka #1 Mill that could be used for yard work.

Motion was made by Raper, seconded by Cass to adjourn the meeting. All Ayes.
