

## Minutes from the Commission Meeting held on

April 10, 2000

The Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the Town of Englewood met in regular session, Monday, April 10, 2000, at 6:00 P.M., in the Assembly Room at Englewood City Hall.

Mayor Simpson called the meeting to order with Commissioners Cass and Raper present. Commissioner Davis was not present. Invocation was given by Joe Cline.

Mayor Simpson informed those present that the computers that were obtained through the Gateway Grant had been installed in the Library and classes were being scheduled for those interested in learning how to use the computers. He also stated that a core drill was being done on the property that was sold to Bill and Steve Sloan and that construction should begin in the next month of so unless there were unforeseen problems.

Motion was made by Raper, seconded by Cass to pass Resolution #29-\$573,300 Water and Sewer Bond Issue Series 2000. All Ayes.

Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Raper to accept the March 2000 Minutes. All Ayes.

Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Raper to accept on Third and Final Reading Ordinance #021400.22-Closing of an Unopened Right of Way- TW Brown. All Ayes.

Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Raper to accept on Second Reading Ordinance #031500.24-Communication Towers. All Ayes.

Motion was made by Raper, seconded by Cass to accept monthly billing errors and adjustments in the amount of \$1944.34. All Ayes.

Jack Ramey was present to ask if the Board would be interested in taking part in being a "Korean War Commemorative community." This has been set up by the Department of Defense because this has already been known as the "Forgotten War". This would commemorate soldiers, families and all those who lost their lives in this war. It would better educate everyone concerning what took place in the Korean War. A committee would be appointed and would conduct three programs from June 2000 until November 2003 that placed emphasis on the Korean War. Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Raper to appoint a committee to take part in this project. All Ayes.

Mayor Simpson then informed the Board that a pipe froze and burst in the Mary Marshall property located at her outside faucet. Ms. Marshall was asking for an adjustment on her sewer. Commissioner Bob Cass stated that he wanted everyone to be treated the same and made a motion to adjust Ms. Marshall's sewer to her average, motion was seconded by Raper. All Ayes.

Cass then discussed the streets. He stated that several ditches and tiles needed to be cleaned out and that some of the streets needing paving were: Dixon, Pond, Sunnyside, Kale, Baker, Short Locust, Melrose and Ferguson and that patching was needed in some areas of town also. Motion was made by Cass, seconded by Raper to spend the balance of paving funds to do these streets. All Ayes.

Mayor Simpson stated that the area on the back side of Conner Drive to the fence leading to the Billy roach property might need to be looked into also.

Motion was then made by Cass, seconded by Raper to make the week of April 24 through 28 clean-up fix-up week in Englewood. All Ayes. Public Works Director Joe Cline stated that this would be strictly for city residents.

Motion was then made by Cass, seconded by Raper to adjourn the meeting. All Ayes.
